



The theme this year is change and many of the events focus on transformation, the implications of the technology revolution and wide-ranging social and political changes, from elder care and homeworking to house sharing.


Funds were raised through various events including a quiz night and a very



The RAF Benevolent Fund, the RAF's leading welfare charity, is launching a Community Engagement Worker scheme to help older RAF veterans get involved in their local communities. The scheme comes in response to research carried out by the Fund which highlighted these challenges as issues which most concern the older generation of RAF veterans.

Pete Ashcroft, Welfare Projects Manager at the RAF Benevolent Fund, said: "The Community Engagement Worker project is just one measure we have introduced to tackle the issue of loneliness and social isolation among older veterans. Other new initiatives include telephone friendship groups and group wellbeing breaks.

This year marks the RAF Benevolent Fund's centenary and we are asking the public to help us reach out to the members of the RAF Family who may have fallen off the radar and let them know, we are here to help. We want to ensure every RAF veteran, no matter how long they served, including National Service, receives the support their service to their country deserves. We want to get these people back onto the radar, and we aim to almost double the number of people we help – from 53,000 to at least 100,000 over the next three years".

The Community Engagement Workers will get to know the social activities, groups and associations across the four counties and work with individuals to understand what the barriers are to them becoming more socially engaged and help them to overcome that, from attending a veterans' breakfast meeting with someone for the first time, to establishing activities where none currently exist.

Matt Rowe, of Peterbough, will be taking on the Cambridgeshire Community Engagement Worker role. His career in the Royal Air Force means he knows the service well. He said: "It has always been deeply humbling, the sacrifices that whose who fought before us made and as an RAF veteran I have some insight into that. "This is an opportunity of a lifetime, and I feel like I'm part of the RAF family again. Success in this job is going to be very different for each person. This is about individuals and what they need to feel part of the RAF Family, and the wider community again."

The pilot scheme will run for two years.

The RAF Benevolent Fund offers a wide range of support for serving and former serving personnel and their families, from financial grants for one-off and day-to-day costs, respite breaks and emotional support. Last year it spent £21M on welfare support for the RAF Family, including:

## **Giant Waste Incinerator**

Cambridgeshire County Council Are Being Forced To Defend Their Objection To A GIANT Waste Incinerator.


The application for an incinerator was rejected in 2018 by Cambridgeshire County Council but the developers are appealing so <u>WE NEED YOUR</u> SUPPORT AGAIN BEFORE BONFIRE NIGHT.

- The Waterbeach incinerator will be at Waterbeach, opposite the proposed New Town and schools on the A10, next door to ancient Denny Abbey, and only 2-3 miles away from schools in Cottenham. The huge furnaces will burn 24/7 for 35+ years.
- The chimney will tower to 80 metres taller than Ely Cathedral which is 66 metres high.
- Particle emissions, dioxins and heavy metals from incinerators are believed to affect health. Incineration reduces recycling rates and contributes to climate change.
- To make it profitable, waste deliveries will come in from TEN counties as well as from Cambridgeshire, making our area a dumping ground. The A10 is already at capacity.
- This is **NOT** the right place for an incinerator, being so close to housing and schools.
- It is not the solution that scientists RECOMMEND for managing waste, increasing recycling, reducing plastic, even creating energy from waste, or protecting the climate.

Cambridge Without Incineration (CBWIN) is a community campaigning group and was instrumental in defeating the initial planning application in 2018.

Running up to the appeal on 5<sup>th</sup> November, the community continues to be at a huge disadvantage to Amey Cespa, as they have very deep pockets and have instructed one of the best law firms in the country (London based). As the Public Inquiry (appeal) is now only weeks away there is added urgency to raise sufficient money so that CBWIN can afford legal and technical experts, to represent local residents in presenting the excellent case we have against this giant commercial and industrial incinerator on the edge of beautiful Waterbeach. CBWIN are registered formally as an interested party on the appeal.

Recently, our local concerns have also been echoed by The Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan, who has called on the Government to stop the building of 'archaic' polluting waste incinerators, as outlined in his opposition to a proposed incinerator in Bexley. The previous Secretary of State, James Brokenshire, also called in and rejected the appeal for a huge incinerator in Hoddesdon earlier this year. Not to mention the clear 'no more incinerators' taken by DEFRA's chief scientist Prof. Ian Boyd, Dame Sally Davies (NHS Chief Medical Officer and WHO executive) and ongoing parli



## **Upware Residents Association - Chairman's Report**

The 2<sup>nd</sup> year of the Upware Residents Association has been a busy one. We started the year with our first Speedwatch session in August 2018 and have held several sessions since then. Hopefully it's had a positive impact to drivers coming through the village.

We had a presentation from Connecting Cambridgeshire about the village having alternative fibre broadband providers by the end of 2019. BT were spotted looking at overhead cables but so far no further progress seems to have been made.

Resident, Andy Davies very kindly spruced up the village notice board and he and Alan Haine made fantastic 'Please mind the Ducks' signs which on the whole seem to have slowed the majority of drivers down and be mindful of our feathered residents.

We had two fundraising firsts this year. Firstly, the hugely successful Christmas Fair which raised £800 towards the purchase of a defibrillator for the village. Along side that we had generous donations from G Webb Haulage, Francis Flower and the Wicken Fete committee helping us come close to our target just after Christmas. The second very successful fundraiser was the Easter quiz night which raised another £116 and meant that we could now buy and install the defibrillator. Residents unanimously felt that the best place to keep this was at the pub, which is after all the hub of the community, with resident, John Collacott kindly installing it. For a small community, managing to achieve this in a year is fantastic and I'd like to thank everyone who helped to realize this goal.

Resident, Andy Cogan gave us a fascinating talk about the history of Upware, adding to the ancient history we discovered last year with the archeological dig.

We had a stall at the Wicken Fete with many residents baking cakes and biscuits to sell. Although it was a blisteringly hot day we still had an enjoyable afternoon and made £50 for URA funds.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> Upware village picnic took place at the beginning of July and everyone who attended had a great time including competing in the annual egg catching championships. Thanks to the raffle and Louisa and Peter Haine generously donating their ice cream profits, we raised a further £80 for the coffers.

Several members of the village took part in CPR and defibrillator training. Many thanks to First Aid Training Solutions for providing the training free of charge. Donations on the night raised £130 to go towards replacement parts for the defibrillator when needed.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank every single resident who has supported the URA over the last year. It has been a fantastic year and I'm very proud to be part of such a great community.

Finally, there are two people who deserve a very special mention. Firstly, Liz Tory for all her hard work on the Parish Council. She has ensured that Upware residents are heard and has raised the village's profile in the
