Parish Website

The Parish Council feels that the parish website is in need of updating and are looking for someone who would like to take this on as a project (free of charge please!). Please let me know if you are interested and I can let you know further details.

Hedges

As spring approaches can we please remind all residents and landowners to ensure their hedges are cut well back within their boundaries so that there is no overhanging foliage on to pathways, pavements or highways. This is an ongoing problem that we'd appreciate your help with. This also applies where hedges interfere with streetlights and road signs.

Precept

The Council has increased the Parish precept to £23,000 for 2019-20. We are seeing an increase in general expenses along with the need to meet the recommendations from last year's Audit to increase our contingency fund, which we will do gradually over the coming years.

Upware – Open Space

After several years, we are finally starting the process to accept the transfer of a piece of open space/recreational land to the Parish Council. This will be a benefit to the residents of Upware and we are appreciative of this opportunity. Once the legal elements are complete, we will work with the residents to decide how best to use the space.







Wicken Runners: The Story so Far

On Sunday 14th Oct the very first Wicken running group set out. 7 adults, 2 children (aged 10 and 8) and 2 very enthusiastic dogs! Some people come every week, others dip in and out as they fancy it – anything goes. We will always go at 9 am on Sunday's even if its just family Robinson.

What does it involve? We start with the 2-mile loop past the visitors centre and back up to Cross Green, finishing back at Pond Green. For all, apart from our mad spaniel, this is at a very steady pace – there are people who haven't run for a long time and children for whom this is the limit of what they can do. We want that loop to be accessible to anyone who would like to join in.

Those that want to go further then set out on a second loop which has varied anywhere from 4-8 additional miles. Some of us are building towards a half-marathon so will gradually increase that mileage.

The only weekend's it won't be on are if we are away or if we are doing a running event. For example there are very relaxed and welcoming 5 and 10km runs in Barrow on 1st Sunday of the month. We will always post of the village Facebook page if it isn't happening.

All who have come have declared it to be very enjoyable – come and try it. We would love to join us.

There are around 1000 of them at the moment, and they come in to roost on St Edmund's Fen almost immediately before dark. It's a spectacular sight and sound!

Visitors are enjoying seeing the magnificent hen harriers as they overwinter here at Wicken Fen. If you can visit in the afternoon as the sun starts to set, head for the Visitor Centre, Boardwalk hide, or our new viewing platform to look out for hen harriers quartering over the fen, looking for a safe place to roost. Our friendly team will be happy to point you in the right direction.

It's the time of year when we start planning for the new season ahead, and looking for new volunteers to help us at Wicken Fen. 

Ten Years On

Time puts on speed, you would think. We did the journey ten years ago for my sake, wanting to see again the site where I once took charmed holidays, the last in 1936. Beyond that I returned on a motorcycle in 1959, keeping my distance but ascertaining it was still occupied. This fine old house on a hill was named Three Chimneys for having one in each parish of Ridgewell, Birdbrook and Stambourne.

A chicken farmer succeeded my grandparents there but the next time I returned my partner and I found the place deserted, although a start had been made on restoration. Then ten years back Liz drove us there only to find the house hidden behind scrub, an old caravan apparently sheltering the owner who has remained a mystery. Ten years on then, Liz again gave way to my curiosity and we returned on the finest day of the year turning Suffolk into dreamland.

Nothing had changed but for the worse. The house stood firm with its six bedrooms and a cellar, the view a blissful exposure of England at its best. The nearest house, once two cottages, could supply us with no information about the deserted one, its owner apparently now in care, Three Chimneys lost for a caring owner.

The farm had been in bad hands for years, my grandfather no lover of hard work, his son lost fro help, the mystery remaining as to how they got the lease. They lost their hold soon after my last childhood visit. The couple moved to Reach, living on Grandma's pension until his arrived. This was ten shillings, their house rent five shillings until they moved on to Swaffham Prior!

Only two years after their marriage their third daughter died in giving birth, a girl who eventually emigrated to America. My last visit to Ridgewell followed, finding Grandma in in pitiful mourning which shortened my visit, but the charm of that farm lingers, encouraging my later visits, leaving me wondering about its fate. Foxes and deer haunted the place, footpaths spread around it, the real thing matching the dream and memory. The journey was a joy, returning via Cavendish, Clare and Long Melford then Lavenham and home. My earlier returns had a lot to do with my art dealers

But there is still a wonderful house out there waiting to be restored. Don't ask me how my Grandparents got it but they were not cut out to stay. While developments spread almost everywhere my memory on the hill stand quite firmly unrequited.

How is the Village Hall Run & A.G.M

How is the Village Hall Run

We're often asked how the Village Hall is run and we thought it would be useful to provide some information about the current arrangements.

The Hall has been run continuously by a committee on behalf of the PCC and the village since 1975, over 40 years. In 2017 the Hall was bought by the Parish Council from the Church. The great majority of Village Halls in England are owned by Parish Councils and this gives them permanence and security. Wicken Parish Council had to take out a loan to pay for the Hall and this led to a small increase in the Council Tax to pay for the loan.

The Hall is leased by the Parish Council to a new charity, registered with the Charities Commission, called the Wicken Jubilee Village Hall Charitable Incorporated Organisation: a bit of a mouthful. The lease is for 21 years and the Hall pays an annual rent of £10. So the Parish Council does not run the Hall or take part in the upkeep of the Hall. No public money is used to support the running of the Hall and all the running costs including oil, electricity, cleaning and all repairs must be covered from money raised by the Hall Committee who are officially Trustees of the Hall.

Funds to keep the Hall running come from the groups who regularly rent the Hall such as the Tiggers, Band and Swallowtails; one off events in the Hall such as parties and celebrations; and the events that the Hall Committee put on like the Spring Fair, Picnic round the Pond, Race nights and so on. On a year on year basis the Hall just breaks even and so it's vitally important that these events continue and are well supported by everyone in the village and beyond. It really is a case of 'use it or lose it'.

Annual Meeting of the Charity Tuesday 19 March 2019

Under the rules of the Charity Commission, there must be an Annual Meeting of the Charity which is open to the public. At this annual meeting the Trustees are up for re-election if they wish.

As you'll know the Trustees have been working hard for the Hall for many years. While working hard, it's also creative and great fun being on the committee. You get involved in so many different things and meet lots of people. Skills like using social media are increasingly important and we're always eager for new ideas for events to run to appeal to different parts of the village.

This year we really want to bring on board new people with new ideas and energy to keep to Hall running effectively for the whole community. So if you are even the slightest bit interested in being involved with the Hall committee, do talk to one of the current Trustees about what's involved. We're all very happy to talk with you and explain more about what we do. You need to be over 16 years old, live in the parish of Wicken and Upware, and not have a criminal conviction.
